Dear Sir or Madam,

I am writing in connection with the application made for a static street trading license with the intention to trade at the corner of Friar Street and Union Street. Along with members of the board at Tudor House Museum, I would like to register my objection to this license being granted.

As one of the most historic streets in Worcester with many properties having significant historic relevance and grade II listed status I feel that the addition of a static street trader selling fried food is not in keeping with the other businesses currently trading along this street who manage to operate their business whilst appreciating the historic nature of their setting.

My concerns are that packaging waste that might be created, the noise of a generator would be intrusive and the smell of fried food could affect business owners in the vicinity as well as residents at Lasletts. The conflict of interest with other café and restaurant owners is also a major consideration when similar traders along Friar Street are attempting to build their businesses. In addition, we do find that around Friar Street and Union Street when busy with pedestrians, people are often forced to step into the road to avoid street furniture; another obstruction on the pavement could impact on the street becoming difficult to navigate for visitors on foot.

To whom it may concern,

I have recently been informed of an application for a static street trader to be positioned directly opposite our front door.

The application was attached to a post the other side of union street and not the one on Friar Street by where I believe the van is to be located. It did take someone else to point the application out to me as it wasn't immediately obvious.

I would like to object to this application for the following reasons;

- From what I can find out on the internet, the van is converted large shiny Airstream which in not I keeping with the historic Friar Street. It would be surrounded by listed buildings, national trust sites and museums. As Friar Street is a well visited and photographed tourist destination, I do feel this would be ill fitting for the location.
- Looking at the offerings stated on the application and again from what I can see online, the food offering looks like it leans towards the deep fried street food. I would worry that the smell from this would not only effect all domestic residents in the vicinity, including myself, but also would have a negative effect on the businesses located in close proximity, especially Thai Gallery and ourselves who have customers sat outside that do not want to be subject to the aroma.
- With customers sitting outside The Eagle Vaults, Steam, Friar Street Kitchen, The Thai Gallery and ourselves, I believe they do so, in part, due to the picturesque views up and down the street, which would be interrupted with the addition of a large catering unit.
- I fear for the safety of the residents of Laslett's alms-houses coming around the corner joining union street as the already tight corner could possibly but restricted further. With the HGV's already struggling to get around the corner and the everyday motorist using this street as 'rat run', any further obstructions that would force people towards the road has got to be seen as a negative thing.
- Without knowing the measurements of the unit I can't say for sure but, I would fear that with the width of the unit, it would create a pinch point on the street with the preexisting furniture outside both Thai Gallery and ourselves.
- It's bringing nothing new to the street. Plant based food can be found at every restaurant these days. Two of particular note would be; The Meeting Place, only several yards away, and Be The Change on New Street. There has been a couple of independent Ice Cream street venders operating along Friar Street and throughout the city who would be affected. Milkshakes can be found at both Friar Street Kitchen and round the corner at Shakeaway. Loaded Fries now seem to be a staple on every restaurant menus.

In conclusion, Friar Street in large is made up of independent traders and as much as it would be nice to have more independents taking up residency on the street, I do feel that a catering van would have a less than positive impact on the street and local residents.
