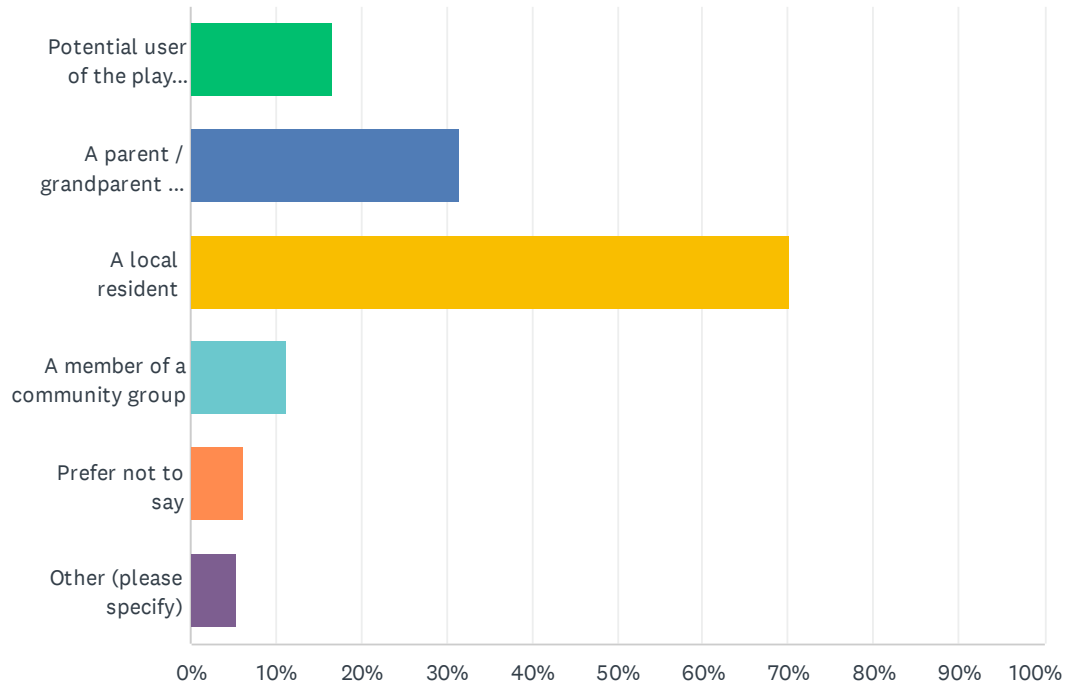

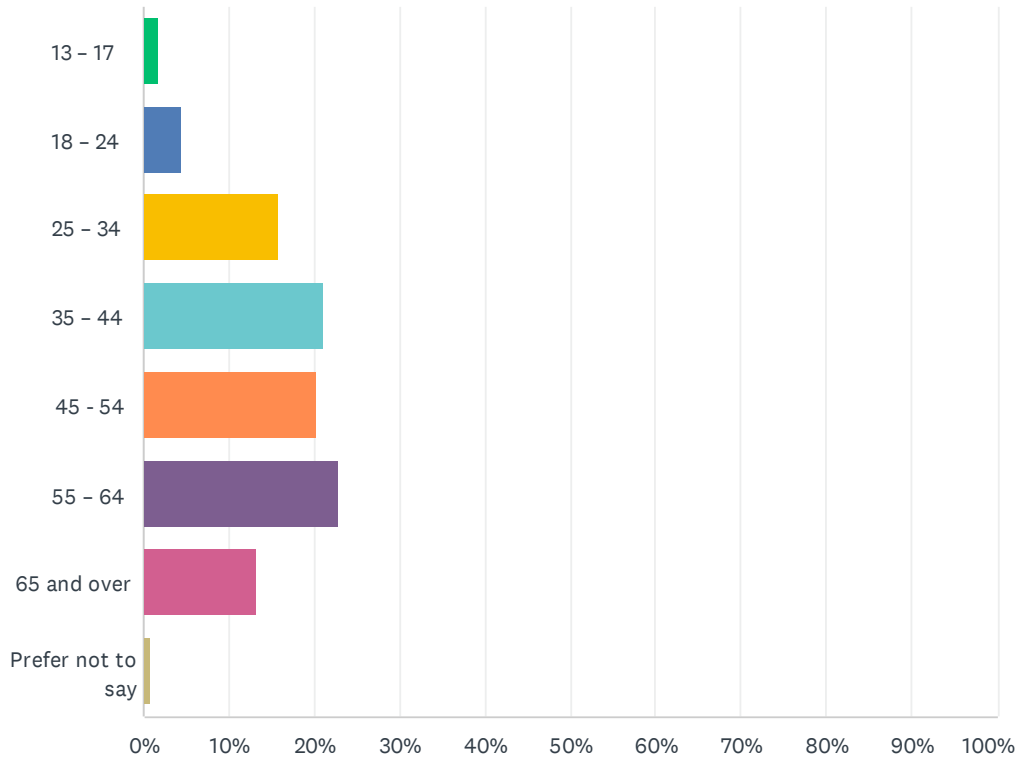

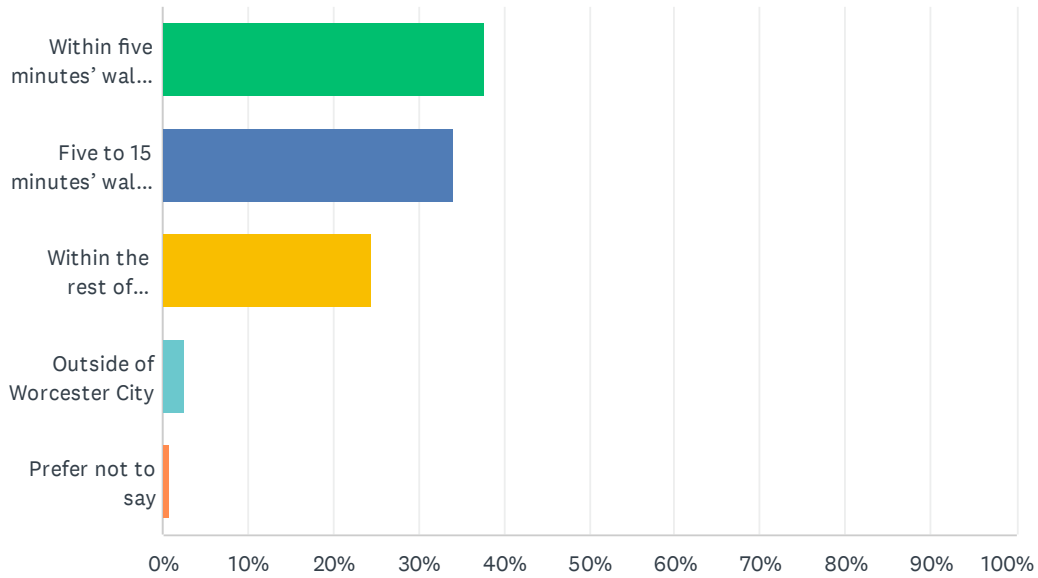

Q3 Where do you live?

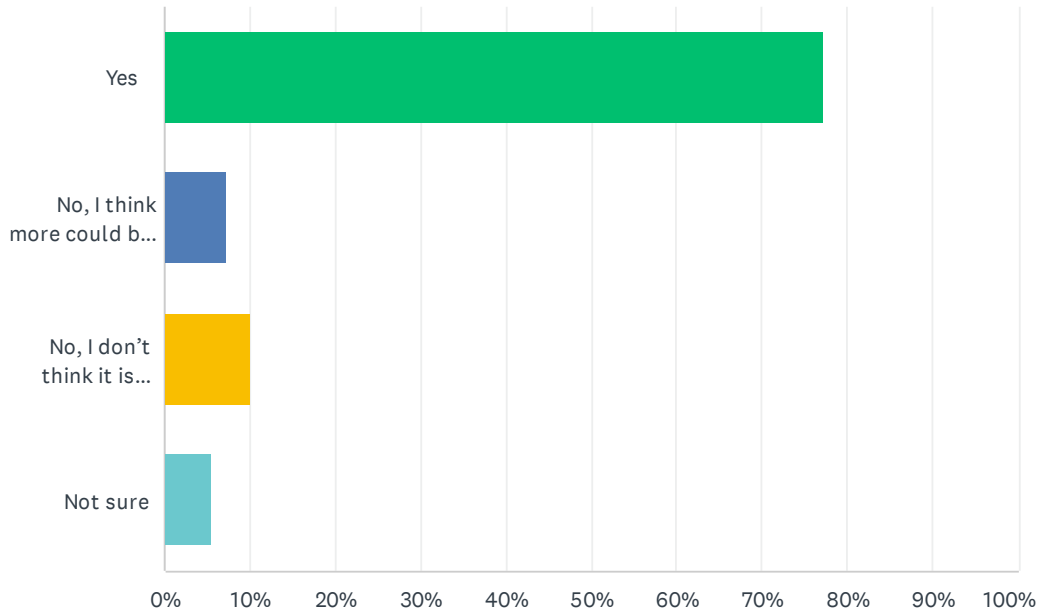

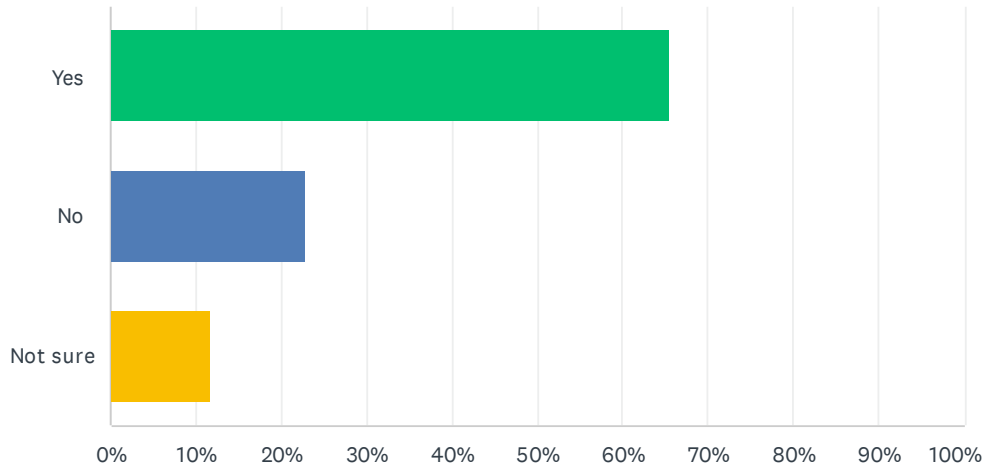

The Biodiversity Enhancement Assessment (BEA) report written by Natural Networks makes recommendations for these areas. Regarding the woodland, adding nest boxes, hibernacula, log piles etc and planting of native species within the wooded areas is really great, but it is important that these areas are not opened up any further to human access, as this would increase disturbance and degrade the habitat for wildlife.

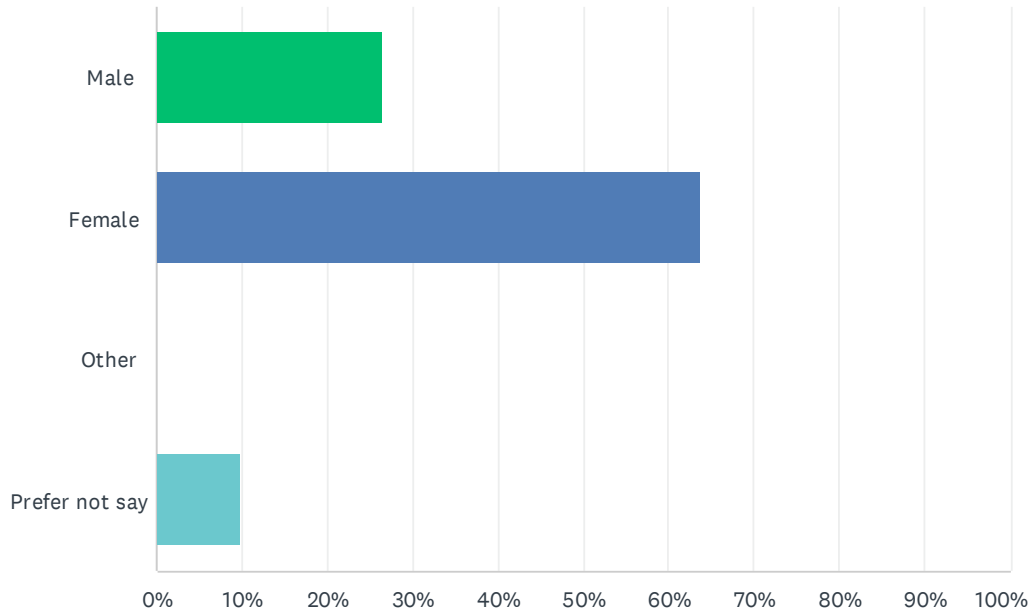

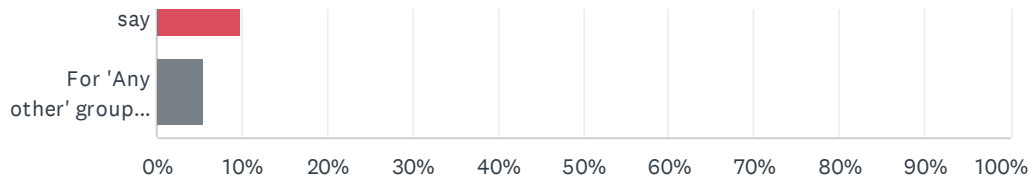
