2	<p>I have been able to submit the same survey multiple times. I can continue to submit a survey as many times as I wish, changing the information each time to look like a new survey result. The group who oppose the pump track are also now sharing the below information to prove a point. I'm aware that Carla, one of the main opposers to the pump track has also been linked into this and you will see multiple surveys with their message to prove the point. Likewise, those in favour of the track have been doing the same. This survey is now null and void and any result will be legally challenged. Has a baseline Ecological Appraisal been carried out before the survey went public? If not, why not? The development is likely to affect the reptiles and aquatic inhabitants of the brook due to the silt potentially being pushed into the brook affecting water quality. An Ecological Appraisal by experts is required to determine whether there are slow worm and grass snake colonies on the proposed site. A slow worm survey lasts about a week. Special 'refuge' mats are strategically placed to attract slow worms out in conditions recommended by experts, i.e. when sunny and not windy during the spring and summer after hibernation finishes to judge how many and how large the colonies are. If slow worm and grass snakes are in abundance, then a reptile exclusion fence around the whole circumference must be erected to keep them out. This would be required to be maintained constantly as a reptile exclusion zone at the developer's expense. Otherwise, an alternative habitat nearby needs to be sought at the developer's expense. Also, the brook drainage is next to the proposed site and the entire area is susceptible to flooding so tarmac that is permeated would be required. Likewise, has a Data Search Developer been instructed to carry out a survey to decide whether any additional lighting is required and how this will then affect the area including the habitat for bats. Have the council considered whether the value of the pump track outweighs the cost to themselves and the cost of maintenance to local residents? Furthermore, have the council considered the noise/nuisance which maybe unlawful. The Human Rights Act states that the general public are entitled to the quiet enjoyment of home/property. It is evident that the survey must be declared null and void. Survey Monkey do not provide a suitable method for determining a non-bias result. Also, the survey can be completed multiple times by an individual who is not resident in Worcester. Legal representatives not based in Worcestershire have been able to complete the survey more than 30 times for both sides, documenting their evidence. The entire idea of a Pump Track took shape back in 2018 when a young St Peter's lad attended a meeting of St Peter's Parish Council with his Mum. As an enthusiast representing lots of other young people, he pointed out the lack of any facilities for a Pump Track or indeed anything of this nature, not just in St Peters, but throughout Worcester. He requested the Parish Council pursue this with the City Council. All residents of St Peter's should have a say in the destiny of the Pump Track, and that includes our young people, whose voices are so often overlooked. This is why St Peter's Parish Council supports this proposal for the provision of a facility requested by the young people living in the local area. Much discussion has taken place over the years about an almost complete lack of facilities for younger people south of the River Severn in Worcester. Battenhall Park, as the largest park in St Peter's Parish, is the obvious venue for consideration for the Pump Track. It's worth noting that the City Council, who have organised the survey and whose initiative this is, recognise the practicality of using Battenhall Park for the Pump Track, which is why it's featured in the survey. The Community Safety Manager and the Design Out Crime Officer both agreed during a site meeting that this was a suitable site. Battenhall Park is easily accessible from anywhere in St Peter's, Battenhall, and Bath Road by bicycle or skateboard etc and does not require travel by car to visit. The proposed site for the Pump Track in the Park (which we do not consider has been particularly well identified on the map in the survey), is well away from housing and wildlife. These are a unique set of circumstances that only apply to Battenhall Park. Because of the size and accessibility of Battenhall Park from a number of approaches, and because users will access the site via existing pedways, there should be no concern regarding a requirement for increased parking. The portrayal of a countryside idyll desecrated by speeding bikes, roller blades and skateboards is sensationalist and perverse. Residents concerned about the potential impact of a Pump Track have cited all manner of wildlife that they allege will suffer as a consequence. Slow worms, Bats, Muntjac Deer, Owls, Parakeets, Sparrowhawks, Red Kites etc have all been claimed to be at risk, but the simple truth is that no wildlife is going to be put at risk or endangered as a consequence of a Pump Track being constructed on ground that is already mown and is likely to be nowhere near Duck Brook or any woodland. Biodiversity and wildlife have been promoted by the work of the Friends of St Peter's Parks within Battenhall Park for many years. The creation of Battenhall Wood and the Pentangle Orchard, at the upper end of Battenhall Park was delivered purely by the Friends Group and funded by the Parish Council. It should be noted that opponents to this project have published a poster / flyer containing misinformation about the Pump Track, this has been delivered directly to resident's doors. The official City Council posters have been damaged and removed from the park and from speaking to residents it appears that the 'say no to the pump track' campaign have found a loophole in the online survey enabling multiple completions of the survey by the same device / person. I use Battenhall Park every day to walk my dog and enjoy watching the varied wildlife which includes a wide variety of birds including birds of prey, deer, foxes, newts, slow worms and cats. Over recent years the park has benefited from the re-routing of Duck Brook, the development of the wetlands area and woodlands with hives for the many animals and creatures that live in the area which MUST be protected! The pedestrian bridge over the wetlands and wildlife information boards have all added to the lovely experience of walking through the park which is now a nature reserve. Many people use the park on a daily basis, particularly the many dog walkers as the dogs can enjoy the safe open field off the lead. If a pump track is built, for the safety of children using it, it would require fencing to stop dogs entering and causing accidents. The location does not have emergency access, again putting children's safety at risk. We know from visiting existing pump tracks like Rushwick and comments by residents in other parts of Worcestershire that not just local residents use them; parents will drive their children from other areas to use it. There is no car park at the proposed location and local roads already have too many cars parked on them making it difficult for residents, emergency services and delivery vehicles to easily pass. 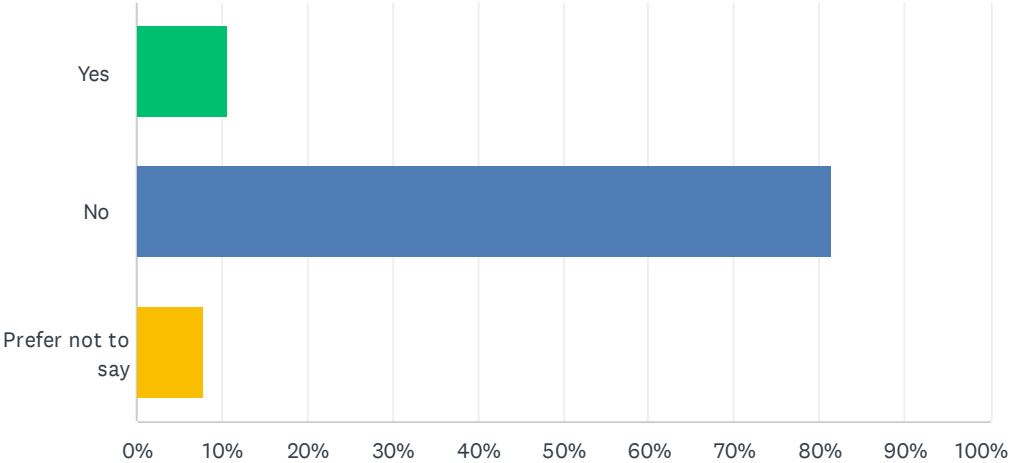

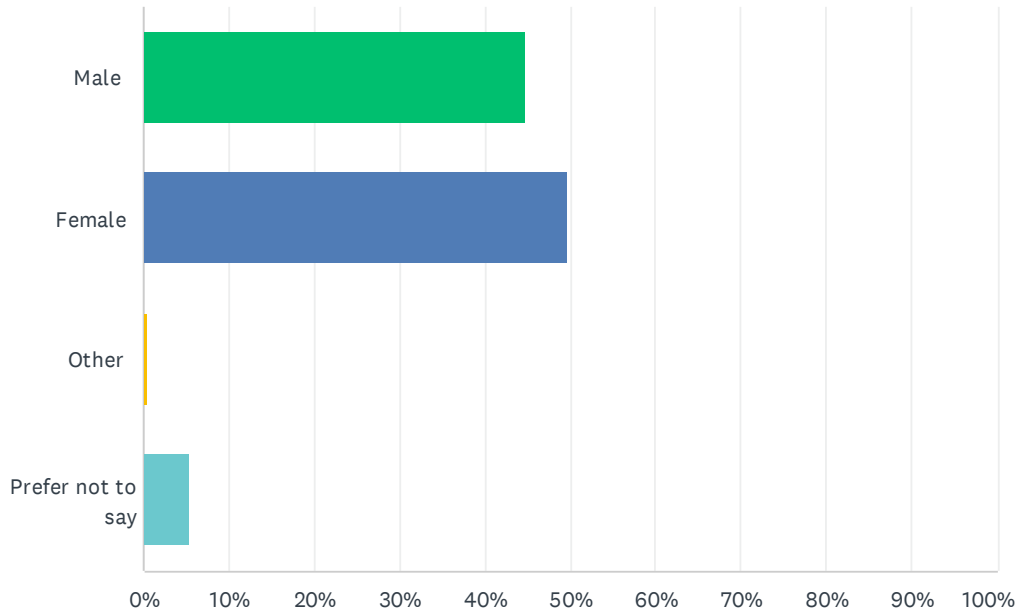

Q10 Gender

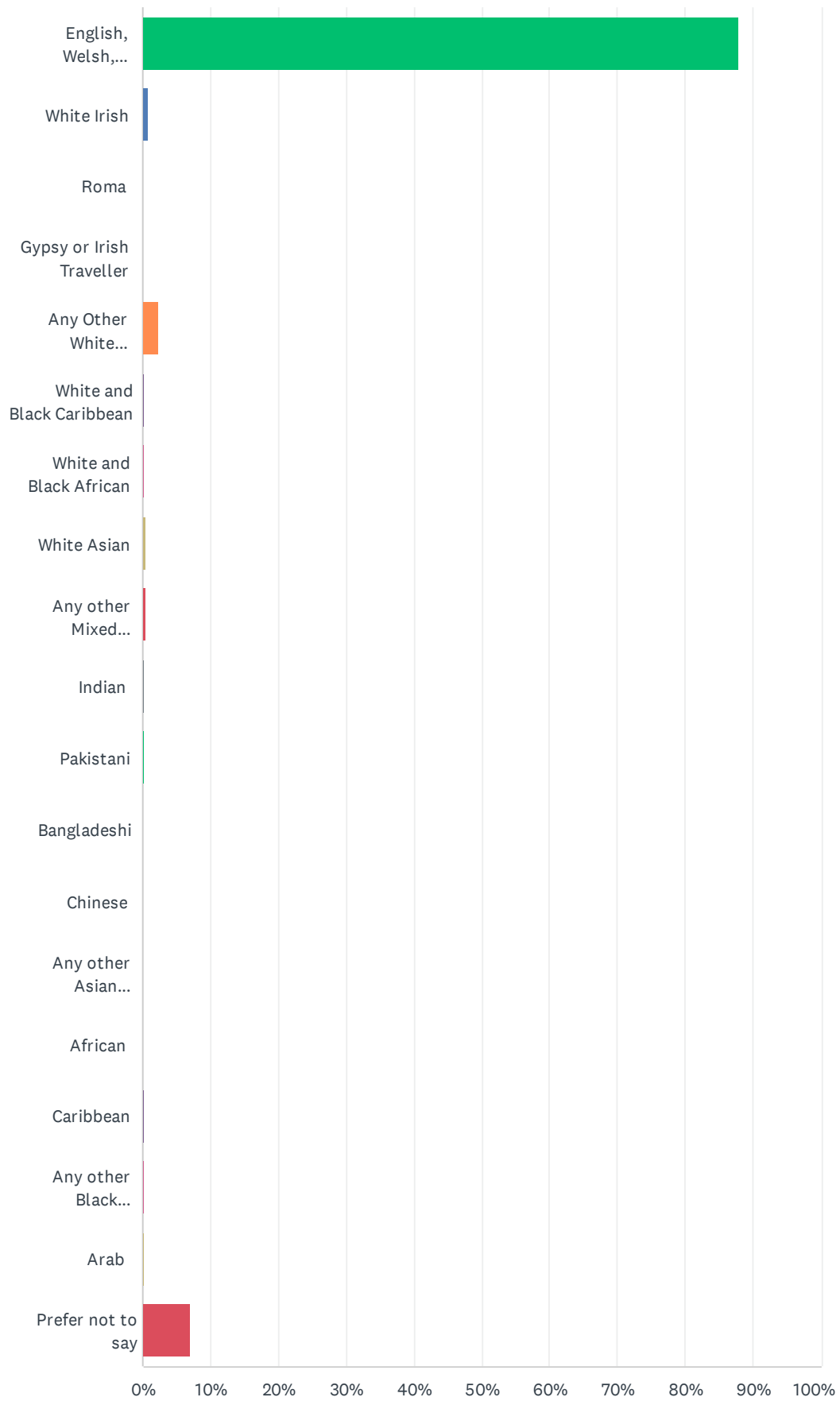
